

CARE INSTRUCTIONS AFTER IMAGE-GUIDED BREAST BIOPSY (Ultrasound, MRI Or Stereotactic)

PATIENT INFORMATION CARD

Instruction:

- Keep the large pressure dressing in place today.
- If told to do so, wear a sports bra or tight-fitting bra for 24 hours after the biopsy. Wear the bra at night when you sleep.
- You may shower 24 hours after biopsy. Cover the pressure dressing before you shower. Do not scrub the biopsy site or soak the dressing.
- You may remove the dressing after 3 days and place a small band-aid over the biopsy incision site.
- After 3 days you can return to all your normal activities.

Things To Avoid:

For three days:

- Do not lift heavy objects with the arm on the side of biopsy.
- Do not do any strenuous activities (swimming, playing sports, strenuous exercise).
- · Do not bathe, swim or soak the biopsy site under water.
- Do not take medicine that has aspirin, ibuprofen or vitamin E. These can cause bleeding problems. Instead, take T. Crocin for any pain or discomfort.

Special Points:

- · Swelling and bruising are common and resolve over several days.
- If you have bleeding from the biopsy site, apply pressure with an ice-pack until
 it stops. Do not keep the ice on for more than 15 minutes.
- Take T. Crocin for pain or discomfort.
- If you have stopped taking any medication for your biopsy, do not resume taking it for three days. Please speak to your referring doctor about when you should restart the medication.

Call Your Breast Doctor If:

Please inform the clinic immediately or go to the nearest Casualty/ Emergency Service if you experience the following:

- Fever: Temperature greater than 1000F
- Excessive pain or discomfort
- · Signs of infection at the biopsy site such as swelling, skin redness or discharge
- Continuous bleeding from the biopsy site.

Biopsy Results:

Biopsy results are ready within four business days. You will receive a call from our clinic once the reports are ready.

- In most cases, if your pathology results are benign (negative for cancer), we
 recommend that you return for follow-up imaging at 6,12 and 24 months after
 biopsy. Please consult your doctor for your post-biopsy follow-up instructions.
- In some cases, the tissue sampled is not benign. Your referring doctor will advise
 you as to your next step. Typically, your doctor will refer you to a breast surgeon
 for a consultation.
